Florida Statutes Section 1012.42 requires that schools report when a teacher is assigned teaching duties in a class dealing with subject matter that is outside the field in which the teacher is certified. All teachers at Seminole Elementary School meet the Florida Department of Education requirements to teach in public schools. This includes certification in an educational subject area as well as, at a minimum, a bachelor's degree from an accredited university. The table above lists all Seminole Elementary School teachers identified as out-of-field for the 2018-2019 school year. The chart also includes current certification held by the teacher and the certification needed to earn in-field designation. Be assured that Seminole Elementary School and Okeechobee County Schools are dedicated to serving every student with excellence as the standard.



#### What is ESSA?

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed into law in December 2015, amending the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 and replacing No Child Left Behind provisions. With a strong, proven accountability system, Florida is already ahead of most of the nation as it relates to the requirements laid out in ESSA. Student performance has consistently improved since Florida introduced rigorous accountability measures.

## ESSA SCORE CARD for Seminole Elementary 2017-2018

- The ESSA Score Card or Federal Index 2017-2018 is data released to the public similar to the SPAR.

  Florida's recent success: Only state to significantly improve on the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) in 4th and 8th grade math and 8th grade reading; 1st among states in Advanced Placement participation; 4th in the nation in Advanced Placement performance; 4th in the nation for K-12 Student Achievement according to Education Week Qualicounts report; Graduation rate at an all-time high of \$2.3%.

## ATTENDANCE FOCUS AT SEMINOLE ELEMENTARY




