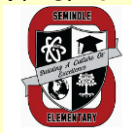

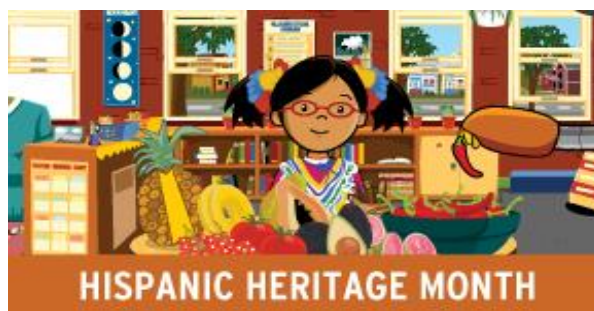

Out-of-Field Teachers

Florida Statutes Section 1012.42 requires that schools report when a teacher is assigned teaching duties in a class dealing with subject matter that is outside the field in which the teacher is certified. All teachers at Seminole Elementary School meet the Florida Department of Education requirements to teach in public schools. This includes certification in an educational subject area as well as, at a minimum, a bachelor's degree from an accredited university. The table below lists all Seminole Elementary School teachers identified as out-of-field for the **2019-2020** school year. The chart also includes current certification held by the teacher and the certification needed to earn in-field designation. Seminole Elementary School and the Okeechobee County School District are dedicated to serving every student with excellence.
